Director's Statement

Frank called me one day, and told me about his idea for the short. I liked it from the start. I tried to assemble the team, but so many people were scared of catching the coronavirus that no one wanted to work with me on it. I had to do what I never wanted do, which was act, direct, film, sound record, and edit everything by myself. It was a challenge, and I had the personal reward of seeing the project completed. Frank Rainone is my mentor, and he was there as a coach. He pushed me to challenge myself, and made sure that I was able to get through every obstacle.

This short film is about a guy during the pandemic learning to exist in the new normal, and as a filmmaker, I grew through this process. The title is also fitting for both myself and the character, since in a way individually, we were both loners.

Filmmaker FAQs

Who or what inspired this project?

As a filmmaker I was easily inspired by the times. We have been placed in a situation that is wholly unnatural and against our conditioned wills. We are being told to behave in a much different way than ever before. Can we handle this for an undisclosed amount of time? I'm really not sure. No one is! - Rainone

What was it like working without a crew?

It was tough, challenging, and fun. I like the fact that people who saw me shooting on the street kept their distance. Normally, they would casually walk right into the shot. - J. Antonio

How does the character relate to you?

Rick and I are both essential workers, and we both are forced to be distant from friends and family. Being out there gave us a higher exposure rate, and so everyone would stay away from me (and him). Where I worked, several guys caught the virus; I was lucky to not be one of them. I kept worrying that I wouldn't be able to finish the shoot if I got sick. Luckily, I haven't gotten sick yet. - J. Antonio

What was it like to work remotely?

It was a whole other universe. As writer/producer, I was on video conference making changes, working together. It was a great experiment, and it worked. And we are going to perfect it. - Rainone.
